In the Temple Law WLC Professional Mentorship Program, upper level (2L/E, 3L/E, and 4LE) students are matched with a woman legal professional mentor (i.e. an attorney, judge, etc.). Through a series of meetings and conversations, the mentor advises law students and helps develop their career goals and skills. Mentors will have the opportunity to share their wisdom and experiences with mentees, and the program fosters new professional relationships.

 - two other check-ins throughout the spring semester.
